Our Honey Badgers absolutely crushed it at the 1st Annual Highland Track & Field Invitational, taking home 1st Place Overall! It was an unforgettable day of competition as we competed with our sister campuses, Madison Highland Prep and Highland Prep West. From the first whistle to the final relay, the atmosphere was electric, and our athletes rose to the occasion to secure the top spot on the podium. The performance on the track was nothing short of dominant, with many of our runners beating their previous personal records in both individual and

relay events. We took home numerous awards across a variety of distances. Our relay teams also showed exceptional chemistry, clinching key points in the 4x100 and 4x400 relays that helped propel the team to our overall victory.
